We had two wonderful workshops, the Kenyan Girls project in April and the Serger Workshop in May, and another coming up this month – the Stitchin' for Kids workshop on June 18th. Then the Marin County Fair will be here at the end of June! Busy, busy times.

Our April workshop was well-attended with members sewing reusable pads, pad-holders, and bags for the Kenyan project. We also purchased some of the articles on Upendo Women's Foundation wish list to round out the personal bags given to the girls (wash cloths, small soaps, underwear). Njeri updated us on this Foundation's progress, which is now branching out to other countries in Africa.

Barsha was our fearless leader into the details of serging at the May workshop. There were approximately 15 members who attended, and a great number of different machines to assist with the basics, from threading, cleaning to oiling and how often. Barsha also gave us many tips on how to use the serger for projects, in ways you never thought possible. Candace showed us the serged flower pin that she had made, and we tested out roll hems, overlocking, and various fabrics. Thank you, Barsha, you are like a glass of fine wine in the middle of chaos!

For those of you working on your Stitchin' for Kids projects, bring all your finished and unfinished items that were checked out to the June 18th workshop to turn in. Also, I have received a number of fabric donations to re-stock their project bins, or to use at the workshop. Thanks go out to members and others for their donations to this outreach activity.

The Marin County Fair will be open on June 30th; so if you haven't signed up for volunteering for a couple of hours, we could use your help plus you get to attend the Fair exhibits and mid-way on this entrance ticket. We are again sponsoring the Crafts & Quilt Faire at Aldersgate on July 16th. MARIN NEEDLE ARTS GUILD PURPOSE

MNAG Statement of Purpose

- *To educate & promote the highest standards of technique & design in the needle arts.*
- *To encourage interest, enjoyment creativity in doing all forms of needle arts.*
- *To promote cooperation and interchange of ideas among those who are engaged in,*

or interested in, needle arts in all parts of the world.

The Guild, a non-profit membership organization, brings together quilters, needle artists and fiber artists. Membership is open to anyone who has an interest in the Needle Arts. Current members include educators and award-winning crafts-people, as well as many enthusiastic amateurs who enjoy learning new skills, sharing ideas and enjoying the company of fellow enthusiasts.

Our goal, in fact, is to promote the Needle Arts through education. This year, 2015, there is a mentoring quilt class on the first Monday of each month and there will be workshop/class the 3rd Saturday of most months.

Members are always available to help anyone interested in learning a new skill, or improving their techniques. Beginners are encouraged to come join us for a fun filled day of learning and productivity. We also invite members to bring guests who may enjoy a particular event.

Mission Statement: The goal of the block of the month program is for members to explore new and old quilting techniques while making a quilt for themselves and one for our outreach program.

OUTREACH

Below is an excerpt from Shirley's information that was provided to the Las Gallinas Lion's Club; it is a comprehensive list of what the guild donated in 2015 Outreach projects. Each of us should be proud of our contributions to the various causes. The Lion's club responded with another donation of \$1000.00 to the guild to be used towards Outreach projects.

1. **Stitchin4Kids**-They give dolls & doll clothing, quilts, hand-made items to children who are in long-term care; they give to children in 5 hospitals twice a year. MNAG provided: 32 doll quilts, 9 infant quilts, 29 hospital games (hand-made), 17 knit “princess crowns”.
2. **Homeward Bound**- They provide housing for homeless families & individuals in Marin. MNAG made 24 twin-size quilts.
3. **Seaman’s Church Institute/Port of Oakland**: The 10 wool scarves/hats provide extra warmth to mariners.
4. Marin Community Center/Pediatric services. MNAG provided 20 infant quilts.
5. Wildcare: They care for injured wild animals with the intention that they be returned to the wild. MNAG made 63 knit bird nests.
6. **Senior Care & Rehab facilities in Petaluma & Marin**. MNAG made 30 blankets/lap robes, 32 activity aprons, bibs, & caps.
7. **Upendo Women’s Foundation**- They support Kenyan girls with the intent that they will be able to attend/stay in school to get an education. MNAG held a workshop and completed over 175 hand-made items and purchased 3 large cartons of personal supplies.
8. **Valley Fire**-Middletown Elem. School-Teachers asked for 800 quilts for K-3 graders. MNAG provided some quilts.
9. **Doodlebug sewing class** (The students call themselves: “Just Add a Pocket”!!)-Elementary children learn to sew & forward needle arts skills. MNAG members provide year-round classes, summer sewing camp for 32 students, materials, & education in needle arts at the “Doodlebug” quilt store San Anselmo. This year the students made infant & doll quilts, stuffed

animals, & doll clothes for Stitchin4Kids & other organizations that MNAG supports.

Other donations: 3 large boxes of infant blankets & clothing for Christmas went to Novato Human Needs Center and to Community Action Marin.

As a reminder the sizes of quilts that we are making for various causes are listed below:

Quilts for **Stitchin for Kids** group:

Isolet/Preemie covering: 24” - 30” x 30” - 36”
cotton or flannel

Older child: 40” x 60” can use Fleece, which can easily be fringed. If fringing and knotting don’t tie knots too tight as they want the item to lay flat! 1 ½ yards fleece is perfect and will make an item about 54” square.

Remember all items going to “Stitchin” group get washed by them before they are donated!

www.stitchinforkids.org/ has information and patterns for a number of items that they give to the children.

Homeward Bound Quilts:

Twin Size 60” x 78” will provide some overhang

Lap or snuggle quilt: 45” x 60” great for watching TV or lounging around

Convalescent and Care Facilities:

Lap Quilts for Wheelchair use 36” x 40”, can’t be too large as they interfere with wheels

Lap Quilts 40”-48” x 60” can be used on beds or while sitting in chair or couch.

Some of the “convalescent” size quilts will be earmarked for Hospice of Marin for their room at “The Tamalpais” in Mill Valley.

KNITTING & WEARABLE ARTS

Wearable Arts/Knitting will be meeting at Aldersgate from 4pm – 6pm, prior to our Monthly meeting and sharing space with the mentoring quilt group. The group has put together several lap

quilts that will be used in outreach. If you have squares Arlene is handling putting them together.

If wearable arts and knitting intrigue you, join us for techniques, tips and inspiration while working on your projects.

As Spring arrives Wildcare Bird Sanctuary will most likely be request "bird nests" for orphaned birds. Check their website for information from previous years.
